




GreenBook MetroView

The Department of Cooperative Governance, overseeing the implementation of the Integrated Urban Development Framework (IUDF), reviewed the 2013/14 Small Town Regeneration Programme which led to a new coherent strategy. The strategy aims to enhance small town regeneration and is aligned with the objectives of the IUDF and other government strategies such as the District Development Model.


